A joint project between the **FIU Asian Studies Program**, the **FIU European Studies Program**, and the **Miami-Florida European Union Center of Excellence**, this event highlights the dramatic changes in Europe, the European Union, and China in light of world affairs over the past 20 years following the remarkable events of 1989 -- the end of the Berlin Wall in Germany and its implications for the Cold War, and the Tiananmen Square incident in China and its importance for changes in Chinese political economy.

The afternoon session is an intimate workshop setting primarily for faculty and graduate students working on area studies; the evening lectures are directed to a more general audience, including students and the community, and are free and open to the public.

Dr. Kellee Tsai is Professor of Political Science and Director of East Asian Studies at Johns Hopkins University. She teaches comparative politics, political economy of development, and Chinese politics. Her publications include *Capitalism without Democracy: The Private Sector in Contemporary China* (Cornell University Press, 2007); *Japan and China in the World Political Economy* (Routledge, 2005), co-edited with Saadia Pekkkanen; and *Back-Alley Banking: Private Entrepreneurs in China* (Cornell University Press, 2002).



Dr. Stephen (Steve) Crowley is Associate Professor of Politics at Oberlin College. His teaching focuses on Russia and Eastern Europe, labor, revolutions, and globalization. His publications include: *Workers after Workers' States: Labor and Politics in Postcommunist Eastern Europe* (Rowman & Littlefield, 2001), co-edited with David Ost; and *Hot Coal, Cold Steel: Russian and Ukrainian Workers from the End of the Soviet Union to the Post-Communist Transformations* (University of Michigan Press, 1997).
