



- The Japan Exchange and Teaching (JET) Program was started in 1987 as a way to promote interculturalization throughout Japan.
- To date, more than 50,000 college graduates from over 50 countries have participated on the JET Program.
- It is the only program of its type administered through the Japanese government and is widely regarded as one of the most prestigious and well-organized language and culture exchange programs in the world.

#### Assistant Language Teacher: (ALT)

Promote internationalization, world culture, and English fluency as an assistant to Japanese English teachers in elementary, middle and/or high school classrooms.

#### Coordinator for International Relations: (CIR)

Assist with activities such as writing and translating speeches and documents, working with international exchanges, and teaching English. Advanced Japanese required.
