Dr. Joseph S. Tulchin served as Director of the Latin American Program at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholar from 1989 through 2005. His areas of expertise are U.S. foreign policy, inter-American relations, contemporary Latin America, strategic planning, and social science research methodology. Dr. Tulchin was previously Professor of History and Director of International Programs at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where he edited the *Latin American Research Review*, and served for seven years as a faculty member of Yale University. He holds a Ph.D. in history from Harvard University, and received his B.A. from Amherst College. Throughout his long career he has taught or lectured in nearly every country in the hemisphere, published more than 100 scholarly articles and more than seventy books. He is currently a consultant to public agencies and private corporations, both in the United States and in Latin America.
