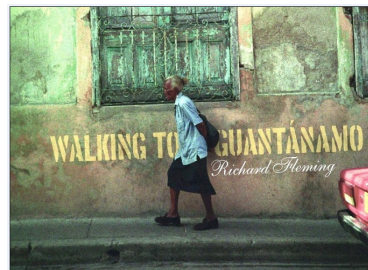

Richard Fleming is an accomplished writer, photographer, amateur musicologist, deejay and inveterate traveler. In pursuit of perfect documentary film audio he has traveled to the farthest reaches of the globe. He has camped in the frozen deserts of Antarctica, accompanied Kofi Annan around the world, flown missions over Kandahar with the U.S. Army Reserve, followed Imelda Marcos on the presidential campaign trail in the Philippines, trudged across the sand dunes of Mongolia, and sweltered on the decks of a nuclear aircraft carrier plying the waters of the Persian Gulf. In 2001 he walked across Cuba. His book about the experience, *Walking to Guantánamo*, has garnered excellent reviews and been compared to some of the greatest works of travel literature. Fleming graduated from Princeton University in 1987. When he is not traveling, he lives in Brooklyn; at the moment, he is desperately trying to decide where to go next.
