## Haiti: One Year Later

As part of FIU's long-term commitment to Haiti's recovery, the School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA), in conjunction with the Latin American and Caribbean Center, the Division of External Relations, and the School of Environment, Arts and Society, is hosting its fourth teach-in on Haiti and the aftermath of the 2010 earthquake. The teach-in will explore various aspects of the situation in Haiti one year after the disaster, including the potential for future seismic activity; reconstruction efforts; the cholera epidemic and other public health issues; ongoing displacement and migration; and the current political climate of the country.

The event will also feature the unique perspective of accomplished philanthropist, writer and documentary-filmmaker, Kimberly Green. As President of the Green Family Foundation and rapporteur for the Clinton Global Initiative Haiti Action Network, she will discuss the changes she has seen in the country and what she envisions for the future of the Haitian people. The presentation will be followed by a Q&A.
