Alejandro Portes is the Howard Harrison and Gabrielle Snyder Beck Professor of Sociology and director of the Center for Migration and Development at Princeton University. His current research projects address the adaptation process of the immigrant second generation in comparative perspective, the role of institutions in national development, and immigration and the American health system. Professor Portes is the author of 250 articles and chapters, and has published 30 books. His most recent book, *Economic Sociology: A Systematic Inquiry* (Princeton University Press, 2010), was one of CHOICE Magazine's 2010 Outstanding Academic Titles.
