Kabbalah and Nature Lecture by Dr. Michael Laitman

Michael Laitman is professor of ontology and theory of knowledge. He holds a PhD in philosophy and Kabbalah, and a Master of Science in medical biocybernetics. He is founder and president of the ARI Research Institute, with offices in Israel, Canada, the United States and Russia, and branches in Central and South America, Asia and Europe. On his website, www.kab.info, he teaches live daily lessons free of charge on Kabbalah, spirituality and the connection with current affairs to an audience of around two million people worldwide, simultaneously broadcasted and translated into eight languages: English, Spanish, Hebrew, Italian, Russian, French, Turkish and German. The site holds the world's most comprehensive educational materials on Kabbalah. He has written more than 30 books, translated into 27 languages, including Chinese. As a scientist and global thinker, Dr. Laitman is a sought-after lecturer and is frequently invited to participate in prestigious international meetings such as the World Wisdom Council, the Club of Budapest and the Goi Foundation. Most recently, he has established ties with UNESCO on the subject of global education. Dr. Laitman's articles and interviews have appeared on important media outlets such as *Il Corriere della Sera*, *Chicago Tribune*, *The Miami Herald*, *Reforma*, EFE News Agency, Bloomberg TV and Sky News, among others.
