To enter the Asian Studies Program, fill out the appropriate paperwork with the university to state your major plan of study. Completion of the Asian Studies Program requires only 36 credits. However, all students must earn 120 credits in his or her Undergraduate career in order to be eligible for graduation.  There are a few requirements that students must meet to complete the Asian Studies Bachelor's Degree. Dynamics of Asia (ASN 4510) or Modern Asia (ASN 4390) and Introduction to East Asia (ASN 3410) are the only courses that students are specifically required to take. However, all students must also take 9 credits in International Political Economy of Asia and 9 credits in Asian Cultural Studies from the Asian Studies course list. In addition, each student must take 6 credits in his/her main concentration (International Political Economy of Asia, Asian Cultural Studies, East Asian Studies, or Asian World Affairs). Because understanding language is paramount to understanding culture, students must achieve some proficiency in an Asian language (e.g. Chinese or Japanese). The level of proficiency required will depend on the main concentration chosen.
