

Bachelor of Arts in Economics

1. Lower Division Preparation (12 credit hours)

You must take the following four courses as part of your lower division preparation:

- _____ ECO 2013 Principles of Macroeconomics
- _____ ECO 2023 Principles of Microeconomics
- _____ MAC 2311 Calculus I (MPS 505+) **or** MAC 2233 Calculus for Business (MPS 460+)
- _____ STA 2122 Introduction to Statistics I **or** STA 2023 Statistics for Business and Economics

* If Math Placement Score (MPS) is below 460, MAC 1105 (College Algebra) must be taken before MAC 2233. If MPS is below 505, MAC 1105 and MAC 1147 may be required before MAC 2311.

2. Upper Division Program (33 credit hours)

The upper division requirements consist of a minimum of 48 credit hours, of which 18 hours are required economics courses, 15 credit hours are elective economics courses, and 15 hours are electives that may be taken in economics or other fields of study.

A. Required Courses for the Major (18 credit hours)

- _____ ECO 3203 Intermediate Macroeconomics (Requires: ECO 2013)
- _____ ECO 3410 Measurement and Analysis of Econ Activity (Requires: STA 2023 or equivalent)

- _____ ECO 4421 Introduction to Econometrics (Requires: ECO 3101, ECO 3203, ECO 3410)
- _____ ECO 4932 or ECO 4933 Topics in Theory (Requires: ECO 3101, ECO 3203, Calculus)
- _____ ECO 4903 Undergraduate Seminar (Requires: ECO 3101, ECO 3203 + Permission)*

**Taken in student's last semester and permission requires an advising appointment.*

Notes:

1. ECO 3410 and ECO 4421 each satisfy the FIU requirement in Computer Competency.
2. ECO 4903 satisfies the requirement in Oral Competency. Enrollment in the undergraduate seminar is usually restricted to students expected to graduate at the end of the semester. Consequently, approval of the undergraduate adviser is required to enroll in this course.

You must take a minimum of five additional economics courses (courses with codes beginning ECO, ECP or ECS), of which at least two must be from the following list of courses which require an intermediate theory course as a prerequisite:
