Fall semester, 2023: ANT 3462 - U01 - Medical Anthropology (Cross listed with graduate section ANT 6469). This version of the course had both undergraduate and doctoral students combined in a common session, with additional reading and assignments for doctoral students.

Fall semester, 2023: Directed two directed studies with GSS students and prepared another through doctoral exam prep.

Spring semester, 2022: Directed two doctoral students in independent studies and doctoral exam prep.

Fall semester, 2022: ANT 6469-U01 / SYO 6405-U01 – Graduate-level Medical Anthropology. Taught graduate-level medical anthropology seminar course.

Fall, 2021-Spring, 2022: Directed graduate student independent studies and exam preparation.

Spring semester, 2014-2021: ISS 6305 - U01 – “Research Design and Methods” (average enrollment: 18). The doctoral-level course focuses upon five phases of the research process: 1) pre-research dilemmas and decisions, 2) theory and the formulation of the research question or hypothesis, 3) design, sampling, and data collection, 4) stages of data analysis, and 5) the implications of knowledge for representation of “subjects” and the expression of this knowledge in the form of written reports or publications.

Fall semester, 2019: ANT 4930 U02 1198: “*Beyond the MCAT: Social Science for Pre-Med Students*”, is a social science course targeting students planning to enter medical school and planning to take the MCAT exam. The course provides social science content relevant to the career trajectories of health science / biology students, and simultaneously prepares them to take the MCAT exam for medical school.

Spring, 2020 and Spring, 2021: SYD 6901 U01 / ANT 4930 U01 1201. “Visual Methods.” This course provides a survey of theoretical and methodological aspects of documentary film and participatory photography for social science students at undergraduate and graduate levels.

Spring semester, 2013, 2015: ANT 6469 – Doctoral seminar in medical anthropology (average enrollment: 8). This interdisciplinary course explores several perspectives in the field of medical anthropology, beginning with some conceptual foundations of the field, and moving into in-depth case studies based on book-length ethnographies from a range of global regions (Brazil, Ecuador, and a multi-national comparative ethnography). The underlying purpose of the course is to develop basic understanding of the primary approaches in this evolving field and how anthropologists have inserted themselves into contemporary conversations on health and healing.

Spring semester, 2016: ANT 3462 - U01 - Medical Anthropology (enrollment: 45). This undergraduate course is designed to expose students to critical approaches to

contemporary global health issues through the lens of medical anthropology. It uses ethnographic and theoretical texts presented in a highly participatory, discussion-based approach, and a humanistic approach to health and suffering.
